Motion by CM Shearer with a second from CM Christy to approve the agenda of action items for the forum meeting of April 11, 2024. All voted aye.

 Motion to approve City Resolution No. 2024-04-11; a resolution of the City Council of the City of Butler, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, undertaking a project under the Strategic Management Planning Program. Motion by Mayor Dandoy. Second by CM Shearer. All voted aye.

- 13.Motion to approve final payment to **CHD Enterprises, Inc.** in the amount of \$13,758.54 for the **Streetscape Grant.** (LIN 18 427 321). Second by CM Shearer. All voted aye.
- 14.Motion to approve an agreement with **Greater Pittsburgh Community Foodbank** for use of the Farmer's Market from 2:30 pm until 7:00 pm on the 4th Tuesday of each month, July, 2024 through November, 2024 and December 16, 2024, for the Walk-up Food Distribution Program. Second by CM Douthett. All voted aye.
- 15.Motion to approve closing a portion of Mercer Street for a **Cycling Event**, sponsored by **Can Am Police and Fire Games-Butler 2024**, to be held on Wednesday, July 17, 2024, from 7:30 AM until 9:15 AM. Second by CM Herr. All voted aye.

The City of Butler consented to the sale of 312-314 Eau Claire Street- 0.40 AC, Butler City, Ward 2, to be sold from the Butler County Repository by the Butler County Tax Claim Bureau to Margaret Smith (tax parcel 562-43-8-0000) in the amount of \$600.00.

The City Treasurer presented a Monthly Intake Report for March 2024.

The City Controller presented bills for payment as follows: from the general fund - \$855,556.88; from the parking fund - \$68,690.26; from the capital projects fund - \$15,437.40; and from the liquid fuels tax fund - \$96,531.78; for a **grand total of \$1,036,216.32**. Motion by Mayor Dandoy with second from CM Shearer to approve payment of bills as presented. All voted aye.

April Public Announcement - Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4)

As part of an ongoing education plan, we would like to remind local residents that when walking your pet, remember to pick up the waste and dispose of it properly. Flushing pet waste is the best disposal method. Leaving the waste on the ground increases public health risks by allowing harmful bacteria and nutrients to wash into storm drains and eventually into the local streams.

Also, if you plan on washing your vehicle, use a commercial car wash if possible. Car washes are setup to treat or recycle the wastewater. If you want to wash your vehicle, pull the car onto a lawn area to wash it. This way, all of the soap and water will infiltrate into the ground. Try not to wash the car on a paved surface as all the runoff will flow onto the street and into a nearby storm sewer. Soaps, wax and other chemicals used to clean cars are toxic to fish and aquatic organisms.
