June 25, 2026

Mayor Dandoy called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Mayor Dandoy and Council members Douthett, Quebedeaux and Herr were present. The pledge of allegiance to the flag followed an invocation given by Deacon Mitch Natali, All Saints Parish.

The following actions took place at the Forum Meeting held on June 11, 2026:

Mayor Dandoy called the Forum meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Mayor Dandoy and Council members Douthett, Quebedeaux, and Painter were present.

Motion by CM Douthett to approve the agenda for June 11, 2026. Second by CM Painter. All voted aye.

1.Motion to approve the lease agreement with **Butler Area Skatepark Association** for the **Party in the Park '26**, to be held at Father Marinaro Park on Saturday, June 27th from 11AM until 8PM. Motion by CM Douthett. Second by CW Quebedeaux. CM Douthett abstained. CW Quebedeaux, CM Painter and Mayor Dandoy voted aye.

- 6.Motion to approve payment of Application #4-Final, to **Hiles Excavating, Inc.** in the amount of \$113,525.54 for the Parking Lot Improvements project. Second by CM Douthett. All voted aye.
- 7.Motion to accept the proposal from **EverOn, LLC** for the Network Cabling Infrastructure – City Building Project in the amount of \$45,436.13. Costars 4400023297. Second by CM Herr. All voted aye.

The City Controller presented bills for payment as follows: from the General fund - \$1,290,038.19; from the Capital Projects fund - \$109,862.60; from the Liquid Fuels Tax fund - \$51,827.26; and from Legacy fund to cover costs in Capital and General Funds - \$315,975.26; for a **grand total of \$1,767,703.31**. Motion by Mayor Dandoy with second from CW Quebedeaux to approve payment of bills as presented. All voted aye.

PERSONS TO BE HEARD:

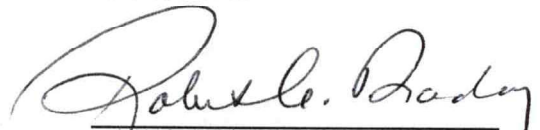
- **Joe Gibson** voiced concerns about potholes in the 400 block of Virginia Avenue.
